This course will focus primarily on some of the most serious worldwide public health problems: HIV, tuberculosis, malaria and infectious hepatitis. In this course, students will be introduced to basic infectious disease research, with focus upon the basic and disease-specific immunology and the basics of host-parasite interactions, without neglecting the “big picture” of public health, which is critical to designing research that is ultimately of benefit to the local public health setting. The aim of this course is to give a solid base of knowledge and of research approaches upon which future research can be built, without neglecting the context in which products from this research could be used.

This course is aimed at students and postdoctoral fellows performing basic scientific research related to infectious disease in health-related fields in low- and middle-income countries, particularly ICGEB member states and African countries.

All students must submit an abstract of their research work with an application and will be notified in advance to present their work as a short oral presentation or as a poster.

Visas, travel to Cape Town and accommodation in Cape Town is the responsibility of the student. Some funds are available for travel to and accommodation in Cape Town. However, there are not enough funds to support all students and this support IS NOT GUARANTEED and CAN BE OFFERED ONLY TO A LIMITED NUMBER OF STUDENTS. You will be informed if you are offered such support.

There is a registration fee of € 100 for attending the course.
