
## What is IUIS-GEC doing to close the gender gap? <a> | <a> |



- **Support female scientists** in early career stages by **sponsoring participation** at schools, courses and meetings.
- **Encourage** regional societies to establish searchable **Women in Immunology Databases** of talented and expert women working in immunology, promoted on society homepages (EFIS, FIMSA, AAI, ASI databases established, ALACI and FAIS in progress) and the IUIS main menu.
- Monitor gender balance of women speakers and chairs at IUIS-affiliated congresses and meetings (Women in Immunology Databases are a terrific resource for women specialists!).
- Initiate childcare supports at immunological congresses and highlight successes of women immunologists by organizing gender equity symposia.
- Enhance pressure on governments, universities and companies to establish strategies to attract and retain talented women in immunology by providing flexible childcare options, encouraging gender equity for grants/fellowships/recruitment panels, increasing the time allotted for earning tenure.
- Roll out these activities by encouraging national societies to establish national GECs.

In 2020, the IUIS-GEC in collaboration with the Menarini Group launched the IUIS-MENARINI-AWARD.

This is the first and only IUIS prize that specifically recognizes women immunologists and their outstanding research accomplishments.



The inaugural US\$ 40,000 prize will be awarded at the 18<sup>th</sup> International Congress of Immunology, Cape Town, South Africa, 2023 (ICI2023).
