The course will be on: Advanced immunology of the "BIG FOUR" (COVID-19, HIV, TB and Malaria) infectious diseases. 50 post-graduate students (Masters, PhD and post-doctoral fellows) drawn from Africa and beyond will be selected. More than 20 eminent scientists will lead the course. Our goal is to provide high quality immunology training and bring together African students and potential mentors to promote career progression of young African scientists.

All selected participants must complete an online pre-course on the Immunopaedia website starting the week of October 24, 2022.

REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY

This 5-day course is open to graduate students enrolled in academic PhD programs and young postdocs engaged in Immunology related research projects.

- The candidates should have some level of research experience to benefit maximally.
- The course has 20 slots for students from the host country Zambia and 30 slots for international students. Female scientists are encouraged to apply.
- Students will be selected based on the quality of the abstract, track record of research output and academic excellence.
- There is a registration fee of \$50 US.
- Selected students will receive partial or full funding to cover registration, accommodation and travel

EDU Opportunities and Challenges



Opportunities

- Continue to provide focused training in immunology in regions where young researchers do not have easy access to such knowledge (LMIC)
- Provide training in "soft skills" (how to write a CV, a fellowship application, a grant proposal; how to prepare a presentation, etc.)
- Establish long-term mentorships (e.g., Immunopaedia ambassadors)
- Further develop Immunopaedia as the central (and only) on-line platform to support all IUIS-EDU teaching activities: expand Immunopaedia Sub-Committee

Challenges

- Flexibility in terms of format (in-person, virtual, hybrid)
- Secure external funds (average costs of an in-person course with full travel fellowships for students ca. 80,000 USD of which 20,000 USD plus 10,000 USD for Immunopaedia SC are provided by EDU/IUIS)



Courses 2023:

- India (October 2nd to 6th; Epigenetics of immune response)
- Chile (November): Mucosal immunity
- South Africa (Pretoria; December before ICI Cape Town)
- Morocco (September)

Expand Immunopaedia platform (IP Subcommittee):

- Complete logistics (on-line advertisement, application, selection, communication with faculty/students, on-line pre-course)
- Expand on content (update, videos, etc)
- Collaboration with existing on-line lecture platforms (e.g., Henry-Stewart Group)

To be included in all future courses:

- Sessions on equity, diversity, inclusion (EDI);
- scientific integrity, how to recognize misinformation



Establish "IUIS-EDU Regional School of Immunology"

- IUIS EDU "courses", "workshops" and "educational activities" to be integrated into a unifying concept of "IUIS-EDU Regional School of Immunology"
- Additional fellowships provided by EDU to attend AAI Schools, DGfI Spring School, etc. to be integrated into this concept
- Format of future "courses" as part of the Regional School concept may vary and may include both in-person and hybrid courses, under certain conditions also on-line only.
